

Social distancing - dropping off and picking up!

We would like to remind you to please follow the queuing system as you drop off and pick up your child. We understand that this might not be great in bad weather but it is important we follow social distancing rules especially with the increase in positive cases in the community. If you need to come into the nursery reception

area we would remind you to wear a mask. Thank you.



Early Years Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of certain benefits such as Universal Credit, income support and jobseeker's allowance and think your child is entitled to free school meals please go to the Hackney Education website to complete the form for free school meals. Without confirmation of free school meals you will be charged the daily rate of £2.00. A daily menu is displayed outside the main entrance.

If you are entitled to free school meals the school automatically gets Early Years Pupil Premium funding of £350 per year. This means that your child will become part of our Natural Explorers group and will be able to go on local trips, be involved in Forest School and gardening activities. We really do rely on this extra funding to make sure our children get lots of different opportunities to extend their learning and interests.

We are giving away a FREE Comet t-shirt to all children who are entitled to free schools meals as a thank you for registering.

Moving to Reception Class in September

If your child is born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 they will be due to move to Primary School in September 2021. We have sent out the Hackney Education guide and would urge you to look at the dates for submission. All applications are completed online.

Usually I would be urging you to go and visit the schools of your choice and some may still be doing some visits. Please contact the schools of your choice to see what they are offering at the moment. It is important to make an informed decision about the best school for your child so take some time to look at their websites, Ofsted reports and speak to other parents who may have children in that school.


Macmillan Coffee Morning
